It's chilly out there GFUMC! As the weather transitions to chillier, change is heating up the things going on at GFUMC! Before the announcement, I want to thank all those who participated in the State of the Church meeting we had on January 11th. As the moderator, y'all made it easy to run the meeting, so thank you very much. Also, thank you to the Church Council that made the setup for meeting easy to follow and effectively able to communicate to the church body why we were gathered. Now, on to a BIG announcement:

**Beginning Sunday February 1, 2026, our church will move to one Sunday worship service each week at 10:00am.** I'm very excited that the church came together and informed the Church Council what *they wanted moving forward, and I believe the Church Council discerned the will of not only the church but also the will of Christ for the Church, the bridegroom of Christ. There are more details about what this change means found further in The Messenger entitled “CHURCH COUNCIL ANNOUNCEMENT”, I highly encourage you to give it a look. With the thanks and the announcements given, let's warm the cockles of our hearts by pouring over some scripture.*

From Jeremiah, chapter 29, verses 11 through 13: “<sup>11</sup> I know the plans I have in mind for you, declares the Lord; they are plans for peace, not disaster, to give you a future filled with hope. <sup>12</sup> When you call me and come and pray to me, I will listen to you. <sup>13</sup> When you search for me, yes, search for me with all your heart, you will find me.” God here is addressing the Israelites and how God will aid them out of captivity, but I believe we can apply it more generally to what it means to trust God. What this verse

helps me with is that in the midst of a changing world, a changing church, and a changing life, God has it all in God's mind.

My mind cannot comprehend God's will, and I know the Israelites didn't understand why they were in exile. However, in the midst of what humanity can view as disaster, God is thinking about peace for us. When our current circumstances instill us with dread about what might be, we can have hope in a God led future. When our world weighs heavy, we call on you in prayer and You hear our prayers.

When God is doing a new thing, we have a unique opportunity: to search for God's will and way. But it's not something we do willy-nilly; it takes our whole heart. And as I reflect on God's call in my heart, I'm wondering what would happen if GFUMC's whole heart was searching for Christ. Where might Christ be found as we search for Him with our whole heart? I believe it will be where we least expect it. It could likely come from an unimagined and unlikely source. Our faith will just need to be open to hearing God's still small voice, not closed and only hearing the echoes of our own hubris and the din of the secular world. That's all from Pastor Jay this month. No matter where you are, always remember you can faithfully seek God, sit at the feet of Christ, and be guided by the Holy Spirit. Go forth to serve your God with patience and passion. Be deliberate in enacting your faith. Be steadfast in celebrating the Spirit's power. And may peace be your way in the world. Amen. (BOW, #559)





## GPS YOUTH MINISTRY



We can trust that God will help us in times of trouble. We have had a fun time demonstrating this idea with dominoes and shaving cream! ## **UNITED METHODIST WOMEN ANNOUNCEMENT**

When I was young, most businesses were closed on Sundays and church attendance took priority over jogging or golfing. In fact, I remember waiting in the narthex of our church to be “ushered” to our seats and if you arrived late, you were “ushered” to the front pew of shame. Maybe that is why people still avoid the front row.

Do you know why churches centuries ago had tall steeples and spires? It was so they could be seen miles away. The sight would lead weary travelers and those in need to a place they knew they could find help and hope. Churches built today rarely have a steeple. That type of advertising is no longer needed.

Our communities were smaller, more intimate and church members felt more like extended family. Folk used their church as a social outlet. Men gathered to do what they do best and the women gathered to do what they do best, all in the service of our Lord. But all of that is in the past. Times change, society changes, and along with that, the needs of humanity change as well. UMW (United Methodist Women) chapters across the country have been folding. Ours was one of the most active ones left. For the past eighteen months, the Godfrey Methodist Women have reached out multiple times asking for people to volunteer in leadership. No one came forward. This situation was discussed among the active members in November and a vote was taken to dissolve the organization. When the vote was announced at the Church Council meeting, some members were concerned if this was a sign the church is in trouble.

I choose not to believe that. Maybe instead God is saying it is time for smaller groups to spearhead specific activities and mission work. Short-term commitments rather than long term. Maybe there is no longer any need for separate men’s and women’s meetings. We’ve all been working together now for years; in the gardens, during bigger events, dinners and more. So, our many caring and social activities will be taken up by groups like the Care Team, NOW and the Wild Bunch. Major fundraisers for missions will continue under the organization of smaller committees who will manage the event and reach out to the entire church for volunteer workers.

In closing, change is inevitable, but what does not change is God and His eternal plan for His people. How we serve the Lord may change, but His call for us to serve never will. He is still seeking fresh leadership. Younger minds, fresh ideas and renewed enthusiasm is critical in continuing the work God has for our church in this community. Whether or not we can put it into words, we are all aware that something is happening; something is different. God is calling His people to trust Him, listen for his call and step up to lead in implementing the changes and growth he has planned for us all.
